#### **Conference Goal / Overview**

This conference is targeted at physicians, nurses, health care management executives, multidisciplinary health care workers, public health workforce, employers, insurance/managed care industry and health care consumers. The goal of this conference is to create a vision of what our health care system will be like in 2010.

The Fourth Annual HSM Conference will be highly interactive, allowing participants the opportunity not only to learn what experts predict our health care system will look like in 2010, but also to have a voice in the discussion! After our keynote speaker provides orientation for the conference and our panelists introduce the eight workshop topics, each participant will select one workshop to attend. During lunch, participants will meet in small groups with the workshop leader to discuss the issues and develop solutions to share with all the participants in the final session. Each workshop group will be asked to identify four key issues pertaining to its topic and the possible solution to those issues. After the interactive workshops, all conference attendees will meet and each group will present its issues and solutions. A panel discussion led by the workshop leaders also will take place. After all the topics have been presented, discussion, questions and opinions will be welcome.


