Statement from the Chair



The Wright State University Department of Surgery focuses on the key areas of patient care, education, research, and community engagement. Individual faculty members work in each of these areas to a varying degree, but the department supports all four as a function of its role in health care and in the community as a whole.

Patient Care

The faculty of the Department of Surgery provides leadership throughout the health care system in Dayton. Dr. Ouellette is the Cancer Care Liaison for Kettering Hospital and one of the driving forces behind the Cancer Care Service Line for Premier. Dr. Minia Hellan is the general surgery liaison for the robotic surgical group. Dr. Peter Ekeh is a member of the Emergency Care Task Force, evaluating ED and Trauma Care throughout the region, and Dr.

Melissa Whitmill chairs the GDAHA Trauma Committee. These three have also served in leadership roles in the MVH DOS over the last several years. Dr. John Matsuura is the chair of the Vascular Division in the DOS and the leader of the Vascular Service line for Premier. He was instrumental in securing a Magellan vascular robot for the hospital through his work with the generous Brethen family. The Berry Family contributed to an endowed vascular grand rounds lecture.

The Trauma Service provides care to 3000 patients in the Greater Dayton Area, a 17 county area of nearly 1.0 million people. Emergency General Surgery is growing, too, with approximately 1500 patients admitted annually. Advanced care practitioners have been integrated into the Trauma Service to provide care for these patients. Performance improvement is a key feature of the Trauma Program and led to initiatives in deep venous thrombosis and benchmarking through the Trauma Quality Improvement Program of the American College of Surgeons.

Education

The number of general surgery residents was increased to eight in 2010 to help address a nationwide shortage of general surgeons. Those residents are now approaching their fifth year in residency. The training program encourages residents interested in a rural practice; this led to the development of a rural surgical rotation described by one of our residents as "the best rotation of my residency." This year's CLER visit prompted resident participation in the Institute for Healthcare Improvement and faculty participation in the Surgical Site Infection Committee and other hospital initiatives.

The DOS currently has four endowed visiting professorships. A fifth, honoring Dr. Richard DeWall, the inventor of the membrane oxygenator, was opened this year.

The job description for an individual with a Master's Degree in Education was developed to assist with student and resident curricula and educational research. That position is currently posted and we are recruiting for an enthusiastic individual.

We have continued to mentor junior and senior faculty through support of enrollment in American College of Surgeons', Association of Academic Surgery's and Association of American Medical Colleges' leadership and education courses and individual coaching and mentoring.

Research

Under the leadership of Dr. Priti Parikh, we have increased the number of publications, presentations, and most importantly, are striving to develop an "Environment of Inquiry" among our faculty and trainees. An academic incentive plan helps reward those activities not funded by patient care. Through these activities, we strive to obtain national recognition for Wright State University School of Medicine. A position for a nurse clinician researcher has been added to the Division of Trauma.

We have also supported the Clinical Trials Research Association through studies in traumatic brain injury, reduction in perioperative myocardial infarctions, and the treatment of sepsis. Basic science on the role of interleukins in inflammation and renal failure is being conducted by our faculty. There are strong collaborations with Bioengineering in patient outcome research and designs for new surgical tools.

Community Engagement

Injury prevention is a core function of the Division of Trauma. A film for teens on the prevention of vehicular injuries was published this year and is being shown throughout the region. Regular school events and secondary prevention activities are a part of the activities of the Injury Prevention Center.

Dr. Roelle is the Director of the High-Risk Breast Center at Miami Valley South and provides genetic counseling to patients and families there.

The DOS has increased its outreach and connections with alumni. A biannual newsletter is sent to alumni, faculty and supporters. We conduct an annual fund drive in July to support education, research, training and innovation in the department. Monthly updates on department activities are emailed to hospital leadership and all staff and faculty members.

Programs/Divisions

DIVISION OF ACUTE CARE SURGERY

The Division of Acute Care Surgery is based at Miami Valley Hospital (MVH), the area's sole American College of Surgeons (ACS) verified Level I center. The Division overall had a productive year from both a clinical and academic standpoint.

Clinical Activities

The surgeons in the division are involved in Trauma, Emergency General Surgery, Surgical Critical Care and Elective General Surgery. Clinical volume continued to be maintained with over 3,000 Trauma Admissions and over 1,600 acute surgical admissions. The faculty engaged in over 1,500 major operations.

Education

Didactic teaching is a regular part of the Division's activities geared towards medical students, residents, fellows and advanced practitioners. Our flagship educational event – the Annual Trauma Update took place on Friday May 16th, 2014. Dr. David V. Feliciano from Indiana University was our keynote speaker. The event was very well attended and featured several speakers discussing various topics.

The Surgical Critical Care Fellowship currently in its seventh year has continued and we are approved as a site for the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma (AAST) Acute Care Surgery fellowship. Dr. T. Dang joined the program in mid-2014 as our Surgical Critical Care Fellow.

Research

In 2014, scholarly efforts from members of the Division resulted in 9 publications in peer reviewed journals, 19 oral and poster presentations in national and international meetings and the receipt of 2 grants.

Dr. Melissa Whitmill was named to both the Graduate and Resident Education Committee and the Item Development Editorial Board Committee of the Society of Critical Care Medicine. She also was the recipient of grant from the Ohio Department of Public Safety.

Dr. Randy Woods served as the President of the Ohio Chapter of the American College of Surgeons (ACS) as well as a member of the Board of Governors for the ACS. He also was recipient of grants from Miami Valley Hospital Foundation as well as Ohio Department of Public Safety.

Dr. Kim Hendershot was the recipient of an EAST Leadership Development Scholarship, Miami Valley Hospital Foundation Grant and Ohio Department of Public Safety Grant.

Dr. A. Peter Ekeh was the recipient of an Ohio Department of Public Safety "Safe Communities" grant. He also was named to the Injury Prevention Committee of the AAST.

DIVISION OF GENERAL SURGERY

The Division of General Surgery continues to provide quality clinical care and advance our educational mission. We are searching for a general surgeon with special training in Minimally Invasive Surgery to advance our Laparoendoscopic clinical activities and simulation training. We strive to advance our consistent broad-based General Surgical training for our students and residents pursuing both generalist and advanced surgical specialty training. We have added Team Based Learning to our undergraduate education and look to further explore innovations in patient care and learning .Our emphasis for 2014-2015 will continue to focus on educating for quality and optimizing care transitions across the continuum.

Clinical Activities

The Division provides referral care for General Surgery, Breast and Laparoscopic Surgery and both General and Vascular care for Five Rivers Surgery Clinic.

Education

Our Annual Post Graduate Educational program was held September 19th at Miami Valley Hospital. Innovations in Medical & Surgical Education was a wonderful opportunity to collaborate with Emergency Medicine, Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology and the WSU School of Nursing for a multi-disciplinary collaborative program, featuring nationally recognized speakers. Participants had the opportunity to network with other educators and explore state-of-the-art topics including entrustable professional activities, simulation and robotic training, and interprofessional learning.

We have integrated a practice management series into our grand rounds schedule to better prepare trainees and community surgeons for the challenges of contemporary clinical practice.

Research

The general surgery division has been productive in research with 5 publications and several local and national presentations. (See scholarly activity for details of all scholarly activity).

Dr. Barney provides daily teaching and surgical supervision for students and residents on the Gold General Surgery service at MVH. Her clinical focus is Breast, Thyroid and General Surgery. Her academic interest is Surgical Education and Practice Management-Surgical Coding and Reimbursement. She serves as Vice-Chair of the American College of Surgeons General Surgery Coding and Reimbursement Committee and ACS advisor to the AMA CPT Editorial Panel. Dr. Barney completed 2 terms on the ACS Board of Governors in October 2014 and remains involved in Health Policy and Advocacy. She serves on the Association for Surgical Education Board of Directors and remains actively involved in ACS-ASE Surgical Student Core Curriculum Project. Dr. Barney was a 2014 Champion of Hope honoree.

Dr. Rundell continues to provide daily teaching and surgical supervision for residents and students in General and Vascular Surgery. He serves as a preceptor in the Five River's Surgery Clinic and Teaching Surgeon for MVH operative cases. A perennial winner of the resident and student

teaching awards, he serves on the Surgical Education Committee and actively manages the resident Mock Oral exam preparation program with Dr. Roelle. He serves as faculty mentor for the WSUBSOM Robert P. Turk Surgery Club. He chairs the MVH Morbidity and Mortality and Endovascular Committees and remains dedicated to Transplant services for the Dayton community as Board Chair for Life Connections.

Dr. Roelle has assumed leadership of the undergraduate surgery education program and 3rd and 4th year clerkships. And has been integrally involved in the M4 surgical prep boot camp and pre-clinical student prep programs. Her clinical focus is Breast Disease and General & Laparoscopic Surgery. She serves as Medical Director of the Miami Valley High Risk Breast Center where she provides counseling and educational activities. She is a member of the MVH Oncology Committee and Breast Cancer Collaboratives. Dr. Roelle attended the AAMC Early Career Women's Faculty Development Seminar and the ACS surgeons' as Educator's course in 2014. Dr. Roelle has continued involvement in community outreach programs for breast cancer and high risk disease.

Kelly Thobe celebrates her 10th anniversary as an integral part of our Gold General Surgery Education and clinical care team. She serves as a supervisor for rotating PA and medical students and a qualified healthcare provider on the Five River's Surgical Clinic faculty. Kelly is our respected senior allied professional in the department and a valued colleague and contributor to the MVH Affiliate Credentials Committee. She provides much appreciated instruction in basic clinical procedural skills for all preclerkship students in the summer clinical skills lab. She mentor's students in the UD and Kettering undergraduate programs with interest in careers as a Physician assistant. Kelly is working to advance our collaboration opportunities with regional PA training sites and explore development of an advanced PA surgical training fellowship.

DIVISION OF OTOLARYNGOLOGY

Division of Otolaryngology

The primary mission of the Division of Otolaryngology in the Department of Surgery is to educate both graduates and undergraduates in the management of diseases of the ear, nose and throat, as well as head and neck surgery. Graduate education is coordinated with the various freestanding institutional based residency and postgraduate programs. Undergraduate education is by lecture, seminar and a two- or four-week Year IV elective. All teaching is accomplished by voluntary faculty members, instead of the usual resident level system, because there is no otolaryngology residency program. The efforts of these voluntary faculty members should be acknowledged and appreciated. The secondary mission of our division is to provide support for clinical research, continuing educational programs, and general community support wherever possible for otolaryngology related activities.

DIVISION OF PEDIATRIC SURGERY

The Pediatric Surgery Department is primarily based out of Dayton Children's Hospital. Along with a thriving practice at Dayton Children's, it has been a goal of the department to extend those services to offsite clinics. Our practice has satellite offices in Springfield and Warren County.

The Pediatric Surgery Department is currently comprised of four full-time and three part-time, board certified surgeons, as well as two nurse practitioners. Two of our part-time surgeons, Dr. Charles Goodwin and Dr. Victor Nanagas, provide care at our off-site offices, allowing our full-time surgeons the ability to be readily available at our main campus location. Dr. Sean Barnett is currently involved in the development of non-traditional off-site programs and will become more clinically active in the summer of 2015.

Three major components that make up our department are Pediatric Surgery, Trauma and Burn/Wound Programs. Pediatric Surgery provides surgical, burn, and trauma care to children ranging in age from newborn through their 21st year. We also provide prenatal consultations to expectant parents with fetal abnormalities so they can be better prepared with information such as prognosis, possible outcomes, etc. All of our surgeons are well equipped to handle any situation indicative of our services. They are all involved in our developing clinical research program.

David P. Meagher, Jr., MD, Professor of Surgery at Wright State University, continues as the medical director of Pediatric Surgery, Trauma and Burns. Dr. Meagher specializes in burns, trauma, wounds, surgical oncology, and minimally invasive surgery for children.

Jeffrey Christian, MD, Clinical Associate Professor of Surgery at Wright State University, has been involved with various committees, such as The Professional Staff Executive Committee and the RMHC Board of Trustees. Dr. Christian specializes in minimally invasive pectus repair.

Jeffrey Pence, MD, Associate Professor of Surgery at Wright State University, is our liaison for the ACS verified Children Cancer Care Center. He specializes in surgical oncology. Dr. Pence is also tasked with overseeing surgery residents and medical students rotating in the Pediatric Surgery Department.

Arturo Aranda-Gracia, MD, Assistant Professor of Surgery at Wright State University is a new addition to our team. He comes to us with special interests in both minimally invasive surgical techniques and the improvement and development of surgical instruments. Dr. Aranda-Gracia is taking the lead on our minimally invasive surgery program here at Dayton Children's. Along with this, he brings his knowledge and experience in urologic surgery.

It is through research, minimally invasive procedures, and the dedication to keep moving forward, that we strive to be the region's first choice for children.

The Department of Surgery (DOS) at the Wright State University (WSU) is committed to excellence in research and education. The research activity is progressively improving in the DOS and lots of exciting things have happened during the last year. Our primary focus is now to perform research in the areas of (1) Improving Healthcare Systems, (2) Translational Research, (3) Acute Care Surgery, and (4) Surgical Oncology. We also participate in clinical trials to improve patient care. In 2014, we published 30 manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals, 6 non peer-reviewed, 8 book, chapters or reviews, gave 93 poster/oral presentations, and received 16 grants. The Scholarly Activity section provides all the details on publications. We have also developed new collaborations with basic science and engineering researchers, and physicians in other clinical departments at WSU.

Grants

The DOS had a great year in terms of grants received and submitted. Dr. Bini and Dr. Armstrong (R4) received a grant on "Aerosolized antibiotics in the treatment of ventricular associated pneumonia: A pilot study" from DAGMEC. Dr. Hendershot and Dr. Woods received a grant on "Simulation education impacting patient safety" from the Miami Valley Hospital Foundation. Drs. Parikh, Whitmill, Hendershot, Woods and Pratik Parikh received an Ohio Department of Public Safety grant for "Spectrum of trauma in the State of Ohio: Improvement and Assessment of Quality Care." Dr. Parikh also received a grant for "VISN 10 simulation-based curricula" from the Dayton VA Medical Center. Dr. Scott has been very active in grant submissions and received multiple grants related to simulation. Dr. Matsuura is participating as the PI for a sponsored study for the Robotics Vascular and Endovascular Registry (ROVER), an international prospective endovascular robotic registry. He was appointed National Principal Investigator for the ROVER Chronic Total Occlusion study. He also started the first phase III clinical trauma on Grifolis fibrin sealant study. (See scholarly report for details).

Research Training

Integral to the mission of the DOS is to provide outstanding scientific training to medical students and surgical residents. Mentoring and guiding medical students requires a significant effort and we are proud that faculty members of the DOS are extensively involved in medical student research and teaching, and helping them achieve the success they desire. We had great presence at the 2014 Medical Student Research Symposium with 16 posters presented by our students. Christina Anderson (MSIII) tied for Best Clinical Research poster on her work on "Cost efficacy of laparoscopy cholecystectomy using the harmonic scalpel". Students also got an opportunity to present their work at the national and/or international conferences. Chris Heid (MSIV), Robert Beaulieu (MSIV), and Zachary Il'Giovine (MSIII) received travel grants to attend national conferences to present their work. Racheal Armstrong (R4) received the medical student research grant awarded by DAGMEC. Congratulations to all the students, residents, and mentors for their great work!

Research experience and significant outcome is now one of the core requirements for surgery residency. The department organizes an annual research symposium for surgery residents where we invite an external

faculty member and the residents present their work to all other DOS faculty members and their peers. This year's annual symposium was held on April 23, 2014, and we had Dr. Nicholas Zyromski who presented on "Necrotizing pancreatitis 2014: what is the surgeon's role?" This year's winners of the Research Symposium were Bob Myers and Sadia Ilyas, MD.

As a part of their research training, several of our residents take a 1-3 year research elective during their residency and work with our collaborators at or outside Wright State University.

DIVISION OF SURGICAL ONCOLOGY

Surgeons in the Division of Surgical Oncology remain on the cutting edge of surgical techniques and advancements in the field. Our mission of pursuing a comprehensive, multidisciplinary approach and individualized care for each patient remains at the forefront of daily practice. There is ongoing implementation of the latest technical advances for Breast, Colorectal, Melanoma, Esophageal, Hepatobiliary (HPB) surgery, and ablation. Research is promoted from within the division and patients benefit from the availability of clinical trials offered locally. There has been a significant increase in the number of patients placed on clinical trials.

The robotic program continues to gain ground with over 400 procedures performed to date. Robotic surgical oncology, as part of the division, has continued to advance. We have taken on some of the most complex surgeries including Whipple procedure for selected patients. There is a high volume of rectal cancer surgery in our practice. Patients have been entered into several studies, both internal and international collaborative, including new fluorescence imaging technology. Dr. Hellan has been integral in advancing the teaching portion of the simulator and cadaver training at the Brethen Center Lab located on the campus of Miami Valley Hospital.

Liver Cancer Center of Ohio (collaborative venture with RPI) continues to be a strong multidisciplinary entity for liver, biliary and pancreatic tumors. The weekly HPB conference continues to draw large audiences on a regular basis with excellent interaction to improve patient care. This also allows the implementation of the most up-to-date technology and treatment paradigms for HPB disease. Several research protocols have opened in concert with Interventional Oncology with use of Yttium 90 liver-directed therapy for hepatocellular carcinoma and liver metastatic disease.

In surgical education, the breast rotation continues to be a strong subspecialty rotation for residents and medical students. There is consistent exposure to the newest thoughts in breast surgery and advancements in real time. Dr. Dunn implemented a more substantive course guide for residents to follow, including time spent in radiology with mammography and stereotactic biopsy techniques as well as radiation oncology, genetic counseling and pathology. Clinical trials have begun with Dr. Weighall collaborating with Nuclear Medicine for modification of sentinel lymph node techniques at Kettering Medical Center.

The Division of Surgical Oncology was active in research with 5 publications and 17 presentations. (See scholarly activity below).

DIVISION OF TRANSPLANTATION

Due to financial concerns surrounding the MVH transplant program, kidney transplantation program was closed in 2013.

Dr. Stevens has completed his access training in South Carolina. He is planning to develop an Access Center at Bethesda North which would include vascular interventions.

Dr. Lucile Wrenshall's laboratory is focused on the interactions between II-2, a cytokine important to normal immune function and the extracellular matrix. Recently the lab has identified an isoform of II-2 that is cytotoxic to cells expressing the II-2 receptor. This isoform may therefore be important in treating certain forms of cancer. Blocking the effect of this isoform may diminish reperfusion injury, which will help kidneys from deceased donors function better and more quickly. These exciting findings have been made possible by collaborative efforts between the Wrenshall Laboratory and the Life Connection of Ohio, and with the Pharmacology and Toxicology Department at Wright State University. Dr. Wrenshall is also collaborating with Dr. Matsuura on an Interleukin-2 tissue study comparing atherosclerotic plaque from diabetic and non-diabetic patients.

DAYTON VETERANS AFFAIRS MEDICAL CENTER

The Dayton Veterans Affairs Medical Center Surgical Department is a multispecialty group offering all aspects of surgical care. These include general surgery and advanced laparoscopic surgery, otolaryngology, vascular surgery, thoracic surgery, urology, orthopedics, ophthalmology, anesthesia, and podiatry. We provide surgical care to our Veterans with attention to VASQIP measures, risk stratification and appropriate patient preparation.

The Dayton VA received recognition by The Joint Commission for its role as a Top Performer on Key Quality Measure in 2012 for Surgical Care. We continue to acquire state of the art equipment for our Operating rooms and are currently in the design phase for an Operating Room remodel.

The Dayton VA, under the direction of National Leadership at the Veterans Health Administration (VHA), is actively participating in the establishment and delivery of a national simulation training and education program – SimLEARN – "Simulation, Learning, Education and Research Network". The construction of our new state of the art center is complete and classes and opportunities are ongoing. The Dayton program includes task trainers directed at different skill sets as well as manikin and scenario based simulation activities.

We have added a new vascular surgeon, Dr. Louisa Pecchioni and one new general surgeon – Dr. Bhoompally Reddy and are in the process of recruiting one more General Surgeon.

Dr. Dana Frazer continues as the Chief of the Department of Surgery. Besides maintaining a busy clinical practice, she has been busy with her recent appointment to the Admissions Committee for Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine. Dr. Frazer completed the Leadership Dayton Class sponsored by the Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce in 2014.

Dr. Anil Krishnamurthy, Chief of Orthopedic Surgery Section, has been selected by the VA National Surgery Office as the Chair of the Surgical Advisory Board for Orthopedic Surgery. He continues to serve on the Admissions Committee for the Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine. Additionally, Dr. Krishnamurthy has applied for a center of excellence in total joint replacement.

DIVISION OF VASCULAR SURGERY

The Division of Vascular Surgery is committed to providing the best care for our patients. Our Board Certification in Vascular Surgery means we have expertise in both open bypass surgery and minimally invasive endovascular surgery.

On December 28, 2013, our division worked with the Miami Valley Hospital Foundation and Mr. Robert and Carolyn Brethen to purchase the Magellan robotic catheter system. This allows us to provide robotic navigation to treat previously inaccessible arterial occlusions. We remain committed to the detection and treatment of aortic aneurysms and have experience in the current FDA approved endovascular devices. Our Miami Valley South Hospital location is also devoted to the care of our patients with varicose vein disorders and offers endovenous laser therapy, vein ligation and sclerotherapy. We are also working closely with our local dialysis centers to offer services for hemodialysis even in patients with known central vein occlusion.

On January 28, 2014, we became the 3rd hospital in the United States to purchase and perform intravascular robotics using the Hansen Medical Magellan system. By years end, we used the robotic catheter system in 37 operations, making us the largest user of catheter robotics in the U.S. We are now a site for the Robotics Vascular and Endovascular Registry (ROVER), an international prospective endovascular robotic registry and with Dr. Matsuura's commitment to intravascular robotics in lower extremity procedures, he was appointed National Principal Investigator for the ROVER Chronic Total Occlusion study. We are also beginning a ROVER radiation exposure study with Dr. Barry Katzen as National PI and will be installing a state of the art "real time" interactive radiation detection system called Raysafe in our endovascular OR suite. Our newly created division also started our first phase III clinical trial on the Grifols fibrin sealant study. We plan to enroll our first patient in March 2015. Dr. Matsuura has also collaborated with Dr. Lucy Wrenshall (WSU Transplant surgeon) on an Interleukin-2 tissue study comparing atherosclerotic plaque from diabetic and non-diabetic patients. Dr. Matsuura is also teaming up with Dr. Caroline Cao (Director Ergonomics in Remote Environments Laboratory (EREL), Professor of Biomedical, Industrial & Human Factors Engineering and Professor of Mechanical & Materials Engineering) on a project evaluating the feasibility of fluoroscopy free endovascular navigation using a 3-dimensional reformatting program and a laser shape tracking system developed by Dr. Cao.




