

Dear Academy of Medicine colleagues:

I am pleased to nominate Anna Squibb, MD for a senior faculty award this year. Dr Squibb is the program director of the WSU Family Medicine Residency. She additionally leads the Addiction Medicine fellowship that she founded at WSU. This fellowship was accredited by ACGME in its first site visit. Dr Squibb teaches on the inpatient service for family medicine and provides OB services at MVH for low-risk deliveries. She additionally founded the Dayton Street Medicine program with Premier and has successfully obtained HRSA funding for family medicine resident training in Street Medicine.

Dr Squibb has provided care across the Miami Valley community throughout her career. She has provided addiction recovery services at Women's Recovery and One Fifteen, street medicine care and teaching in East Dayton at the Dream Center, and inpatient and obstetrical care at Miami Valley Hospital. She is the quintessential primary care physician in this regard: a force across all aspects of clinical care. Dr Squibb is a trusted teacher of medical students, residents and her colleagues.

I highly recommend Dr Squibb for this award.
