- Alternative access to the library resources is available through WINGS, the Wright State University web portal. <http://wings.wright.edu/>
 - There is a tab labeled “Library” where you can customize your access to databases and journals.
 - Use WINGS for email and calendar access also.
- All the electronic resources we have available are accessible remotely. Start at the library website and you will go through the library proxy server using your name and UID#:
- **OhioLINK**, Ohio’s state wide academic library consortium provides access to many additional resources. Name and your WSU UID# are required for authentication.
- **PubMed access**: use the library website access to PubMed to be able to link to as much fulltext as WSU and OhioLINK have to offer.
 - This is really important! Both WSU and OhioLINK have added links to PubMed for fulltext. If you do not use the library website access to PubMed, you will not see these links. Look for icons labeled **FindIt!** or **OhioLINK EJC**. There is also an automatic connection to our **FREE** Interlibrary Loan service, Illiad, if the article is not available electronically.
- **RefWorks** - for when you do research, write for publication or just want to keep track of references to resources...
 - Helps keep your citations organized in a database
 - Works with MS Word to create bibliographies
 - Is web-based so you can use it from any internet connected computer

 - **RefShare** – “sharing” component of RefWorks; you can email a list of citations from your RefWorks database to colleagues

- **MDConsult** - fulltext of over 50 current medical textbooks, 80 journals including “Clinics of North America”
- **FIRSTConsult** – for differential diagnosis, evaluation and management of medical conditions, patient education, procedure skills review, including a PDA download
- **Access Medicine** – fulltext of numerous medical textbooks, including Harrison’s and a board review option
- **Access Surgery** – fulltext of surgery textbooks, including *Schwartz’s Principles of Surgery* and *Zollinger’s Atlas of Surgical Operations*, animations and videos of procedures, board review options
- **Access Emergency Medicine** – fulltext of emergency medicine textbooks, numerous images, videos, and animations, point-of-care treatment answers
- **ACP Medicine** – comprehensive textbook of internal medicine
- **Clinical Pharmacology** – drug info, comparison, interactions, adverse effects and more, mobile app is available, contact Bette Sydelko for an access “code”
- **The Cochrane Library** - fulltext systematic reviews and MUCH more
- **Clinical Evidence** – from BMJ Publishing Group, evidence based answers for therapy questions, 240 conditions covered
- **ACP Journal Club** - structured abstracts of selected articles from 100 clinical journals, evidence-based
- **ACP PIER** - evidence-based resource from the American College of Physicians
- **PsychiatryOnline** - includes the *DSM-IV-TR*, *American Journal of Psychiatry*, and practice guidelines from the American Psychiatric Association.
- **PubMed** - be sure to access through library website for most fulltext article coverage
- **The Medical Letter** (also includes *Treatment Guidelines from the Medical Letter*)
- **NEJM** (*New England Journal of Medicine*)
- **JAMA** and the Archives Journals
- **JAMAEvidence** (includes fulltext *Users’ Guide to the Medical Literature* and *The Rational Clinical Examination*)
- **Nature** and Nature specialty journals
