John R. Goldblum, M.D., is the chair of the Department of Anatomic Pathology at the Cleveland Clinic. He specializes in the interpretation of biopsy and resection specimens in the fields of soft tissue pathology and gastrointestinal pathology for Cleveland Clinic patients and non-Cleveland Clinic patients throughout the United States and the world.

Goldblum is the coauthor of *Enzinger and Weiss's Soft Tissue Tumors*, 6th edition, 2013, and coeditor of *Pathology of the GI Tract, Liver, Biliary Tract and Pancreas*, 2009. He has lectured nationally and internationally about anatomic pathology and has published more than 200 peer-reviewed articles.

He has been listed in Top Doc's in *Cleveland Magazine*, 2004-2008, and The Best Doctors, 2003-2004. He is a member of the United States and Canadian Academy of Pathology, the American Society for Clinical Pathologists, Gastrointestinal Pathology Society, American Gastroenterological Association and American College of Gastroenterology.

He completed a fellowship in surgical pathology and a residency in anatomic pathology at the University of Michigan Health System. He earned his medical degree from the University of Michigan Medical School and his undergraduate degree in biology from the University of Michigan.
